

NEW MASTER OF SCIENCE IN AIR TRANSPORT MANAGEMENT PROGRAMME LAUNCHED



The inaugural programme, commenced with a cohort of 14 students, combines compulsory air transport core learning with an increased focus on leadership and personal development.

On 3rd November 2014, the Singapore Aviation Academy celebrated the launch of its new Master of Science in Air Transport Management (MSc in ATM) programme. This programme is jointly organised with Cranfield University of the United Kingdom. The launch is an important

milestone for SAA. By enhancing its education and training offerings, it aims to serve the needs of aviation professionals in the Asia Pacific region.

The inaugural programme commenced with a cohort of 14 students from Singapore, Malaysia, Germany, Canada and Tanzania. Aimed at busy working executives, this part-time programme combines compulsory air transport core learning with an increased focus on leadership and personal development. Optional modules are also available to participants to meet their individual interests and career aspirations.

The course comprises 6 compulsory modules of 3 days each at SAA in Year One, a choice of online and in-class modules and a compulsory group project in Year Two and an individual research project to complete the Masters in the third year. CAAS officers can also attend the individual modules as a short course.

MSc in ATM provides quality lectures by an academic group specialising in ATM that includes air transport economists, marketing specialists and aeronautical engineers. In addition, the programme imparts learning through various channels including case studies, talks and sharing sessions by aviation industry experts and industry visits to key aviation facilities.
