NEW MBA IN AVIATION AIMS TO DEVELOP TALENT FOR GLOBAL AVIATION SECTOR



Those interested in pursuing a Masters in Business Administration in Aviation (MBAA) will be pleased to know that it is now available at the Singapore Aviation Academy (SAA), the training arm of the Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore (CAAS). Theadvanced degree programme is part of continuing initiatives by CAAS to build human capital for the international aviation industry.
