1	<b>Vaccinated Travel Pass (VTP)</b>	<p>Applications for the VTP will open on 1 September 2021, 0001 hours (Singapore time).</p> <p>Applications for the VTP must be made between seven and thirty calendar days prior to the intended date of entry into Singapore. The VTP is valid for single entry up to six calendar days from the intended day of entry to Singapore. 2	<b>Vaccination Status</b>	<p>Travellers must have been fully vaccinated in their country of departure or Singapore.</p> <p>An individual is considered fully vaccinated 14 days after he or she has received the full regimen of Pfizer-BioNTech/Comirnaty, Moderna or other World Health Organisation Emergency Use Listing vaccines.</p>	√	√	√

<sup>1</sup> Short-term visitors refer to foreign travellers who are not Singapore Citizens, Singapore Permanent Residents or Singapore Long-Term Pass Holders.

3	<b>Travel History</b>	All travellers, irrespective of their nationality/citizenship, must have remained in their country of departure and/or Singapore in the last 21 consecutive days prior to departure to Singapore.	√	√	√
4	<b>Designated Flight</b>	<p>Travellers from Germany or Brunei Darussalam must travel on non-stop designated flights.</p> <p>Travellers, who are not on the VTL, or are transiting beyond Singapore, are not allowed on the designated VTL flights.</p> <p>Travellers are advised to refer to Lufthansa, Royal Brunei, Scoot and Singapore Airlines' websites for details of the designated flights.</p>	√	√	√
5	<b>COVID-19 Testing</b>	<p>Travellers are required to take the following COVID-19 Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) tests:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b><u>Pre-Departure PCR Test.</u></b> Travellers must undergo this test within 48 hours before the scheduled departure time of their designated VTL flight to Singapore and obtain a negative test result certificate in English.</li> </ul> <p>Travellers can contact and take their test at an internationally accredited or recognised laboratory,</p>	√	√	√

Day 1 refers to the traveller's date of arrival in Singapore<sup>2</sup>. They are required to undergo their COVID-19 PCR test by 1500 hours (Singapore time) on each day at a designated chain of clinics.</p> <p>Travellers may make an appointment booking for their Day 3 and Day 7 PCR tests with any of the designated clinics by using their unique link, which will be emailed to them upon their arrival in Singapore. They will only</p>			

<sup>2</sup> Day 1 refers to the day that the traveller clears arrival immigration in Singapore. To illustrate, if the traveller clears arrival immigration at 2330 hours (Singapore time) on 1 October 2021 (i.e. Day 1), he/she is required to undergo COVID-19 PCR tests on 3 October 2021 (i.e. Day 3) and 7 October 2021 (i.e. Day 7). If the traveller clears arrival immigration at 0030 hours (Singapore time) on 2 October 2021 (i.e. Day 1), he/she is required to undergo COVID-19 PCR tests on 4 October 2021 (i.e. Day 3) and 8 October 2021 (i.e. Day 7).

6	<b>Self-Isolation till Negative On-arrival COVID-19 PCR Result is Notified</b>	<p>After taking the on-arrival COVID-19 PCR test at Changi Airport, travellers are to immediately take private transportation, taxi, or private hire car from the airport to their declared place of accommodation<sup>3</sup>.</p> <p>Travellers must isolate alone, or with household members who are vaccinated and have the same travel history, arrival date and self-isolation requirement, until their on-arrival test result is confirmed to be negative. If there are other occupants in the accommodation, without the same travel history, arrival date and self-isolation requirement, the traveller(s) must isolate in an individual room with an en-suite toilet. The test results will be out within 24 hours.</p> <p>After being notified of their negative on-arrival test results, travellers will be allowed to go about their activities in Singapore.</p>	√	√	√

<sup>3</sup> The accommodation must be an individual room with an attached toilet at a residential (ie. HDB flat, condominium or landed property) or non-residential accommodation (i.e hotel or serviced apartment). 7	<b>COVID-19 Travel Insurance</b>	<p>Short-term visitors must purchase travel insurance for the entire duration of their stay in Singapore, with a minimum coverage of S\$30,000 for COVID-19-related medical treatment and hospitalisation costs, prior to travel to Singapore. Should their COVID-19 treatment cost go beyond S\$30,000, visitors will have to pay for the excess.</p> <p>For more information, please refer to <a href="https://safetravel.ica.gov.sg/health/travelinsurance">https://safetravel.ica.gov.sg/health/travelinsurance</a>.</p>	√	×	×
8	<b>Contact Tracing</b>	<p>To facilitate the contact tracing process, short-term visitors will be required to download and register for the TraceTogether app on their mobile devices prior to departing for Singapore.</p> <p>They must keep the TraceTogether app activated during their stay in Singapore and must retain the app with the data on their mobile devices for 21 consecutive days after departing Singapore.
