# **Overview of Competency-based Training for Cabin Crew and the Use of Child Restraint Systems in Air Travel**

Innovation in the design of child restraint systems have also pushed this discussion and there will be a sharing on the different types of child restraint systems available to the travelling public and their overall benefits. The industry will find it beneficial in learning about the different possibilities and its implementation from an airline's perspective.
