KEEPING COVID-19 VACCINATIONS UP-TO-DATE

This Circular provides an update to companies and agencies on the arrangements to facilitate our airport workers to get their additional booster dose so as to maintain their up-to-date vaccination status. This Circular supersedes Circular 24/2022 issued on 14 Oct 2022 and Circular 25/2022 issued on 2 Nov 2022.

MOH's Guidance on Up-to-Date Vaccination

2. Keeping an individual's COVID-19 vaccinations up-to-date protects one against the disease, minimizes the risk of transmission, and protects our healthcare system from being overwhelmed. Vaccination is free under the National Vaccination Programme for all Singapore Citizens, Permanent Resident, Long Term Pass Holders and certain Short Term Pass holders.

3. Individuals should keep up-to-date with COVID-19 vaccinations to be wellprotected from COVID-19, by adhering to the following two recommendations:

- a. Persons aged 5 years and above should complete **three** mRNA or Novavax/Nuvaxovid doses, or **four** Sinovac-CoronaVac doses to achieve <u>minimum protection</u>.
- b. On top of achieving minimum protection, persons aged 12 years and above who have achieved minimum protection should receive an additional booster dose between five months to one year from their last dose to keep <u>up-to-date</u> with their COVID-19 vaccination. The updated bivalent vaccine is recommended for this.

Vaccination at Joint Testing & Vaccination Centres (JTVC)

4. Since November 2022, eligible airport workers have been able to walk-in to any of the JTVCs to receive their booster dose by showing their airport/staff pass. The **Pfizer-BioNTech/Comirnaty bivalent vaccine** and the **Moderna/Spikevax bivalent vaccine** are available at the JTVCs.

Vaccination at Raffles Medical Group (RMG) Clinic at Terminal 3.

7. To facilitate airport workers taking booster dose, airport workers can go to RMG clinic at Terminal 3 to receive their booster dose effective 5 Jan 2023. To avoid congestion and extended waiting time, airport workers are encouraged to register for an appointment at <u>https://appt.rafflesmedicalcentre.sg/APW</u>. Airport workers may also walk in to the RMG clinic without an appointment, subject to availability. Details of the COVID-19 vaccination service provided at RMG Clinic are as follows:

Location: RMG Clinic, Basement 2, Terminal 3

Operating hours: Mon-Sun: 08:00am to 12:00pm, 01:00pm to 06:00pm (last appointment: 05:45 pm)

Vaccine offered: Moderna/Spikevax bivalent vaccine

8. All eligible airport workers are strongly encouraged to utilise this arrangement to keep up-to-date with their COVID-19 vaccination. We seek companies and agencies' support to strongly encourage their workers to obtain their booster dose either at JVTCs or at RMG clinic located at T3 Basement 2.

Reporting of Status of Booster Dose to CAAS

9. As communicated in CAAS Circular 24/2022, companies and agencies are requested to submit a monthly update on the status of the booster dose amongst their eligible workforce who are categorized as Category A^1 and Category B^2 workers.

10. Companies and agencies are to continue to submit the required information through: <u>https://go.gov.sg/2ndboosterdose</u> every first Monday of the month, by 12 pm.

¹ Category A is defined as air crew and workers involved in cleaning and disinfection services; or those who come into close contact with travellers and their belongings, or physically handle air cargo (i.e. direct interaction).

² Category B is defined as airport workers delivering essential services, or office staff involved in COVID-19 related work (i.e. indirect interaction).
