## CAAS Circular 2020/24

### **ADDITIONAL MEASURES FOR GENERAL AVIATION FLIGHT ENTERING SINGAPORE UNDER CURRENT CONTEXT OF COVID-19**

1 This CAAS Circular 2020/24 supersedes CAAS Circular 2020/11. CAAS Circular 2020/11 is no longer in force with immediate effect.

2 All air crew (pilots and cabin crew) and passengers on a general aviation flight to Singapore must submit a health declaration, as required by the Director of Medical Services under the Infectious Diseases Act (IDA). The health declaration must be submitted via the SG Arrival Card e-Service before departure but no earlier than 3 days before entering Singapore. The acknowledgment received from the Singapore Immigration and Checkpoint Authority (ICA) must be submitted to the ground handling agent of the flight before departure. All air crew and passengers must update their health declaration if there are any changes.

3 If any air crew or passenger has indicated “Yes” to any of the declarations on having:

- a. pneumonia or COVID-19 infection;
- b. symptoms of fever and/or other symptoms of respiratory illness; or
- c. contact with any case of COVID-19 in the last 14 days,

the operator of the flight will have to operate the flight as a medical evacuation (medevac) flight, and the unwell air crew or passenger will be considered a patient. The relevant Ministry of Health (MOH) directives regarding medevac flights operating to Singapore will apply.

4 Air crew and passengers who make false declarations can be prosecuted under Singapore law, including the IDA. The penalties for such false declarations include imprisonment and/or fines.

5 Air crew and passengers are reminded to comply with all measures in force, including those contained in previous CAAS circulars.
