

**Summary of Vaccinated Travel Lane (VTL) Requirements  
for travellers from Singapore seeking entry into the Republic of Korea (ROK) on or after 15 November 2021**

No.	Requirement	Details
1	<b>Vaccination</b>	<p>A traveller must present proof of vaccination issued either in the ROK or Singapore.</p> <p>An individual is considered fully vaccinated 14 days after he or she has received the full regimen of Pfizer-BioNTech/Comirnaty, Moderna or other World Health Organisation (WHO EUL) Emergency Use Listing vaccines. This includes mix-and-match vaccinations, as long as the doses are on the WHO EUL.</p> <p>Children or persons who are medically unfit to be vaccinated are not allowed to travel under the VTL.</p>
2	<b>Travel History</b>	<p>All travellers, irrespective of their nationality/citizenship, must have remained in the ROK and/or Singapore in the last 14 consecutive days prior to departure to the ROK.</p>
3	<b>COVID-19 Testing</b>	<p>Travellers are required to take the following COVID-19 Polymerase Chain Reaction (PCR) tests:</p> <p><b><u>Pre-Departure PCR Test.</u></b> Travellers must undergo this test within 72 hours before the scheduled departure time to the ROK and obtain a negative test result certificate (electronic or physical copy).</p> <p>Travellers can contact and take their test at an internationally accredited or recognised laboratory, clinic, or medical facility recognised by the Singapore Ministry of Health (MOH).</p> <p><b><u>On-Arrival PCR Test.</u></b> Short-term travellers or travellers with long-term stay visas travelling under the VTL must make an online reservation (<a href="https://safe2gopass.com">https://safe2gopass.com</a>) for the test at any of the three COVID-19 testing centres in Incheon International Airport prior to their departure from Singapore. Travellers must receive the COVID-19 PCR test at the COVID-19 testing centre located in Incheon International Airport upon arrival. The test result should be ready in 12 hours.</p>

No.	Requirement	Details
		<p><b>Day 6 or 7 PCR Test.</b> Short-term travellers or travellers with long-term stay visas who stay in the ROK for 8 or more days are required to take a PCR test at a medical clinic designated by ROK government on Day 6 or Day 7 of their arrival in ROK at their own expense. The arrival day will constitute as Day 0. More information on designated clinics would be updated by the ROK government. Travellers who miss their test may be fined by the ROK government.</p> <p>In accordance with the ROK's current quarantine response guidelines, 'travellers who have been fully vaccinated in ROK' and 'travellers who have been fully vaccinated in Singapore and obtained quarantine exemption certificate from the Korean Embassy' must receive the COVID-19 PCR test at the local health centre under the jurisdiction of the district in which the traveller's residence and accommodations is located and wait at their residence or accommodations until the test result proves to be negative.</p> <p>The cost of the PCR test in ROK is approximately 135,000 won -180,000 won (S\$150-S\$200). If the traveller tests positive for COVID-19, he or she would be quarantined and treated at hospitals designated by the ROK government, and is responsible for their medical expenses.</p>
4	<b>Self-Isolation till Negative On-arrival COVID-19 PCR Result is Notified</b>	<p>After a traveller's test sample is being collected at the COVID-19 centre in Incheon Airport, travellers must install the 'Self-Check Mobile App' and leave the centre by taking either a taxi or personal vehicle (separate from the general public in the ROK) to move to their residence or accommodation.</p> <p>Travellers should wait at their own residence or accommodation for the COVID-19 PCR test result. The test result should be ready in 12 hours. Once a traveller has been notified that they have tested negative for COVID-19 (via e-mail), the traveller is exempted from quarantine and will be required to update their daily health status in the 'Self-Check Mobile App' for the duration of their stay, up to 14 days. Travellers will not be required to update the Self-Check Mobile App after the 14<sup>th</sup> day, if their stay is more than 14 days.</p> <p>More information on the Self-Check Mobile App is available on <a href="http://www.ncov.mohw.go.kr/selfcheck">www.ncov.mohw.go.kr/selfcheck</a>.</p>
5	<b>COVID-19 Travel Insurance</b>	<p>Short-term visitors must purchase travel insurance for the entire duration of their stay in the ROK, with a minimum coverage of 30 million won (approximately S\$34,000) for COVID-19-related medical treatment and hospitalisation costs, prior to their travel from Singapore. They have to carry with them a physical copy of their insurance policy.</p>

No.	Requirement	Details
		Should their COVID-19 treatment cost go beyond 30 million won, visitors will have to pay for the excess. Travellers are free to purchase a travel insurance policy from any provider.
6	Visa	Travellers would need to obtain a valid visa (for visa-required individuals). Visa-exempted individuals would need to obtain the electronic travel authorization ( <a href="http://www.k-eta.go.kr">www.k-eta.go.kr</a> ) before entering Korea.
