

Fellowship Programme for Arab Civil Aviation Organization (ACAO) 2025/2026



Under the Memorandum of Understanding between the Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore (CAAS) and the Arab Civil Aviation Organization (ACAO), fellowships sponsored by the Singapore Government are offered to government officials of eligible ACAO Member States, that are also developing ICAO Member States. Fellowships are offered for SAA courses listed in table below. Each fellowship covers course fee, hotel accommodation and daily allowance. Who should apply

Government officials:

- who have received endorsement/nomination by your Director-General of Civil Aviation or equivalent. States should nominate only one applicant per course to enable more States to benefit from the fellowships.
- whose job qualifications/work portfolios are relevant to the course applied for.

When and how to apply

The application deadline for each course is <u>16 weeks</u> before the course start date. Fellowship applications should be submitted online via this <u>application link</u>.

Documents required

Nomination form endorsed by your direct reporting officer (Part 1) and the Director-General of Civil Aviation or equivalent (Part 2). Please download a copy of the nomination form <u>here</u>.

How do I know I am successful in my application?

Applicants will be informed of the outcome of their application <u>12 weeks</u> before the course start date. Successful applicants will receive an Award Letter via email and need to confirm acceptance of the Award.

Entry and visa requirements

Please ensure that:

- your passport has at least <u>six months'</u> validity beyond the date of your intended stay.
- you have a valid entry visa for Singapore and relevant transit visas for your travel, if required. Please also bring a copy of the Award Letter to Singapore to facilitate immigration clearance.
