SERVICE STANDARDS FOR PROCESSING OF AVIATION SAFETY INSTRUMENTS RELATED TO AIRWORTHINESS, FLIGHT OPERATIONS AND TRAINING ORGANISATIONS

CAAS is committed to service excellence and continually strives to improve its service delivery to stakeholders. This Information Circular (IC) contains Service Standards for the processing of Aviation Safety Instruments (ASIs) related to airworthiness, flight operations, and training organisations.

- The processing of these ASIs normally takes the following sequence: Formal Application, Document Evaluation, Validation and Issuance of ASI.




Figure 1: Service Standard for Aviation Safety Instruments (ASIs)

- In this IC, the Service Standard provided is reflective of the typical processing time between official acceptance of the application and the issuance of the ASI (see Figure 1 below). Applicants must note, however, that official acceptance of the application is taken from the time when all required documents are submitted fully and the receipt of payment (where applicable) as required in the Air Navigation Order or Air Navigation Regulations. CAAS reserves the right to reject an application at any phase of the process if it was deemed that the applicant could not meet the regulatory requirements.




Figure 2: Service Standard for renewal of organisation approvals

- Applications for the renewal of AOCs must adhere to the minimum number of days prior to expiry of the existing certificate, as stipulated in the regulations. For renewals of other organisation approvals, applicants are advised to submit their applications 5 weeks to 2 months before the expiry of the existing approval/certificate. To ensure currency of application details, applicants are strongly discouraged from submitting renewal applications more than 2 months before expiry.
- For timely submissions, upon demonstration of continued compliance, the renewed approval/certificate will be issued no less than 1 week before expiry. Late submissions may result in issuance of renewed approvals/certificates less than 1 week before or after the date of expiry, potentially leading to disruption to applicant's operations.

Engineering Approvals

8 Service standards for engineering approvals:

Singapore Technical Standard Order (STSO)	4 - 12 months	Subject to complexity, some STSO may require up to 12 months or even longer to complete due to the numerous tests required.

Certificates

9 Service standards for certificates:

Certificate of Airworthiness (C of A)		
C of A (New Aircraft)	1 month	Issuance of certificate subject to the date of Transfer of Title of the aircraft.

C of A (Used Aircraft)	1 - 3 months	Subject to condition, age of the aircraft and availability of the aircraft records. Issuance of certificate subject to the date of Transfer of Title of the aircraft.	
Renewal of C of A	1 month	-	
Export C of A	1 month	Subject to readiness of the aircraft for inspection.	
Certificate of Registration (C of R)			
C of R (New Aircraft)	2 weeks	Issuance of certificate subject to the date of Transfer of Title of the aircraft. Application must be together with or before application for Certificate of Airworthiness.	
Certificate of Registration (C of R)			
C of R (Used Aircraft)	1 month	Subject to condition, age of the aircraft and availability of aircraft records. Issuance of certificate subject to the date of Transfer of Title of the aircraft. Application must be together with or before application for Certificate of Airworthiness.	

10 For registration of an aircraft type that is not in the Singapore Aircraft Register, CAAS will need to grant a letter of acceptance of the type certificate for the aircraft. The process may take several months depending on the design complexity of the aircraft types.

11 Service standards for permits:
