

PACK IT RIGHT FOR YOUR FLIGHT



The carriage of dangerous goods on board a flight may endanger the safety of an aircraft or its passengers. Dangerous goods are items that are liable to ignite, explode, react dangerously, or emit toxic fumes under normal transport conditions, and are capable of posing significant risk to health, safety, property or the environment when transported by air. Hence, aviation authorities have put in place regulations on the type of items that can be carried on board a flight.

To educate the travelling public on what can and cannot be carried on board, the Civil Aviation Authority of Singapore (CAAS) rolled out the 'Pack It Right For Your Flight' campaign. The campaign will highlight the different types of restricted baggage items and how they should be packed. For example, prohibited items are not allowed on an aircraft at all, while other items are only allowed in hand carry or checked baggage.
